What is an eTranscript?

- What's wrong with paper?
 - Despite the use of security paper, fraud is a growing problem
 - Delivery of paper is slow and expensive
 - Does not reasonably provide for delivery confirmation
 - Is generally not trackable
 - Does not support automated operations



What is an eTranscript?

- → Electronic Data Interchange (EDI)
 - The transfer of data between different schools and organizations using networks, such as VANs. The network in American Higher Education is the
 - The American National Standards Institute (ANSI) approved a set of EDI standards known as the X12 standards.
 - EDI has been in the higher education sector for nearly 2 decades. Growth has been slow.



What is an eTranscript?

- ▶ Extensible Markup Language (XML)
 - A general-purpose markup language that supports a wide variety of applications. It's more famous cousin is HTML. XML is very flexible.
 - Its primary purpose is to facilitate the sharing of data across different information systems, particularly systems connected via the Internet
 - The Postsecondary Electronic Standards Council (PESC) provides technical standards for the exchange of transcript data streams using XML.



What is an eTranscript?

- Portable Document Format (PDF)
 - An open standards format created and controlled by Adobe Systems
 - PDF files are exact images of the original document in a device-independent way. The PDF format can represent complex documents that use a variety of different fonts, graphics, colors, and images.
 - There are multiple options to create PDF documents and to read PDF documents. Most of these options are free.



What is an eTranscript?

- Security?
 - EDI, XML, PDF are inherently NOT secure
 - Security must include a non-repudiated source and document authenticity
 - Proprietary certifications are expensive and time consuming
 - Public/Private Key Infrastructure provides industry standard strong security
 - Trusted networks are secure at the network and document level



The Exchange of Transcripts

- Admission to college
 - Typical freshmen admission process
 - High school to 2-year or 4-year school
 - Value of the transcript in the application process



The Exchange of Transcripts

- College to College Transfer
 - Community college to 4-year
 - 4-year to 4-year for a variety of personal reasons
 - Summer school enrollments
 - Course equivalency



The Exchange of Transcripts

- Undergraduate to Graduate/Professional
 - Common to require a transcript during the admission application and a final transcript after graduation
 - May involve a "clearinghouse" such as medical, law, dental, veterinarian, etc.
 - Admission may be centralized or decentralized
 - Receiving credentials from overseas schools
 - Degree and program equivalencies
 - Document fraud



The Exchange of Transcripts

- **▶** School to Employer
 - Validate completion of degree for employment
 - Background verification
 - The "Inconvenience Factor"
 - The "Fraud Factor"



The Exchange of Transcripts

- **▶** School to Student
 - Usually not for advising purposes
 - For employment
 - Tuition reimbursement from employer
 - Private scholarship application
 - Sometimes just to have a copy!

Setting the stage

- Student service issues
 - US Mail is too slow, no delivery control
 - Overnight mail is too expensive
 - Typical student question Was my transcript delivered?
 - Typical recipient question Is this document authentic




Setting the stage

- No cost to receive a transcript
- ✓ Connected to the internet and free Adobe Reader
- ✓ Sign-up online or at the booth
- Cost to send a transcript
 ✓ \$2,500 initial network membership fee
 - \$500 annual renewal fee
 - ✓ \$1.00 per transcript sent
- Cost to send a transcript (SCRIP-SAFE paper customer)
 \$500 initial network membership fee
 \$500 annual renewal fee
 \$0.55 per transcript sent
