The Bahamas has two different options: the Bahamas General Certificate of Secondary Education and the Bahamas High School Diploma. The documentation requirements are different depending on what the student completed, so please note the differences. Also, there are many American high school programs in the Bahamas; see United States of America for the documents required.

For students submitting the BGCSE, we cannot use the scores printed on the student's internal high school transcript since the school is not the exam body and cannot attest to the scores.

BHSD documents are issued on MOEST-approved format but may be sent by either the MOEST or the institution attended.

Students at private schools may follow a different national curriculum. If so, look at the documentation requirements for that country.

Evaluation Policy for Evaluating Caribbean Offshore Medical, Dental, and Veterinary Education

Reason for Policy:

At present, the Global Transcript Evaluation Team requires that Caribbean offshore medical schools be accredited by the Caribbean Accreditation Authority for Education in Medicine and Other Health Professions (CAAM-HP) with a status of "Accredited" or "Accredited with Conditions". However, several countries within the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) have agreements with the Accreditation Commission on Colleges of Medicine (ACCM), some of which predate the creation of CAAM-HP, to accredit their medical programs. Additionally, two local entities (Nederlands-Vlaamse Accreditation or NVAO [Accreditation Organization of the Netherlands and Flanders and the Grenada Medical and Dental Council) are recognized by the U.S. Department of Education's National Committee on Foreign Medical Education and Accreditation as having standards comparable to US accreditation standards. Accepting credentials from Caribbean offshore medical institutions accredited by additional appropriately recognized accrediting bodies will enable Walden University to better serve its applicant pool.

The National Committee on Foreign Medical Education and Accreditation (NCFMEA) is a committee under the U.S. Department of Education responsible for assessing the accreditation standards of non-US medical schools and determining if those accreditation standards are comparable to US accreditation standards (the Liaison Committee on Medical Education or LCME). Non-US schools accredited by NCFMEA-recognized accreditors are eligible to participate in the federal student loan program. NCFMEA currently recognizes four CARICOM accreditors as comparable: CAAM-HP, ACCM, and two local entities (Nederlands-Vlaamse Accreditatieorganisatie [Accreditation Organization of the Netherlands and Flanders] or NVAO and the Grenada Medical and Dental Council).

The Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates provides certification of non-US medical graduates. This certification is required for the United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) and is typically a requirement for residency/fellowship programs and by US state medical boards for licensure. Beginning in 2024, individuals applying for ECFMG Certification must be a student or graduate of a medical school which is accredited by an agency recognized by the World Federation for Medical

Most of the academic post-secondary institutions in the Bahamas will use US-style credits and grades, but always check the credential before determining if the credential you are evaluating uses US-style credits and a US-style grading scale.
